Re: Ashton Coal Mine 2016 Independent Environmental Audit

Ashton Coal Operations Limited (ACOL) operates under DA 309-11-2001-i as modified (the consent). Conditions 8.8 to 8.10, Schedule 2 of modification 10 requires an independent environmental audit of ACOL to be undertaken one year after commencement of construction and every three years thereafter until five years after completion of mining in the DA area. While ACOL now operates under Modification 5, the audit was conducted under the Modification 10 consent.

Please find attached a copy of the 2016 Audit Report including ACOL's response to the audit recommendations below for your acceptance. Please note that the audit report was finalised on the 19 December 2016 and in accordance with Condition 8.8 of the consent has been submitted to the Director General of DP&I, Singleton Shire Council, the Office of Environment and Heritage, the Environmental Protection, NSW Office of Water, the Department of Resources and Energy, Roads and Maritime Services, the Mine Subsidence Board and the Community Consultative Committee within the required two week time period (2 January 2017).
